Freshwater Pearl Mussel – Key Facts

- Live in river bed amongst stable cobbles and gravel
- Only occur in near pristine river systems
- Filter feeders they help to keep our rivers clean
- Long lived up to 140 yrs old!
- Complex lifecycle dependant on Salmon and / or Trout
- Under threat of extinction in Ireland and Western Europe
- Juvenile mussels are especially sensitive to environmental conditions
- Ireland's populations are amongst the largest remaining in western Europe
- Most Irish populations are at risk of extinction unless action
- is taken

- High nutrient input to river systems
- High sediment input to river systems



Possible solutions Fencing and maintenance of buffer zones alongside rivers ✓ Maintaining / restoring riverside habitat ✓ Drain management ✓ Use of drinking troughs Reduced stocking rates ✓ Nutrient management planning
